REDDIE announces London Design Festival 2026 programme with reclaimed timber workshop and artist showcase



Bowl-making with REDDIE

Australian-Indonesian furniture brand [REDDIE](#) will open its Clerkenwell showroom to the design community during London Design Festival 2026, with a hands-on workshop and a showcase by emerging artist [@cpycat.art](#) in the space.

On the morning of Wednesday 16 September, REDDIE will host a bowl-making workshop led by Founder Caroline Olah. Using offcuts from waste timber, participants will sand and stain their own bowls to achieve a refined finish, experiencing REDDIE's approach to working with reclaimed materials first-hand.

Caroline will share the story behind the brand and how it works with post-industrial building waste in Indonesia, including reclaimed timber, and how these materials are incorporated in its designs.

Alongside the workshop, REDDIE will host emerging artist [@cpycat.art](#) (Chloe Chia) in the showroom to present her collection [Imperial Fruit Thieves](#).

Chloe Chia's textile designs, including silk scarves and tea towels, feature patterns depicting former imperial colonies and territories, replacing William Morris' English garden with the native flora and fauna threatened, destroyed or exploited by colonial activities in each region.

The programme builds on REDDIE's recent opening of its first European showroom in Clerkenwell. The 2,000 sq ft space showcases the brand's core collection alongside new releases, and also acts as a creative hub for events and workshops within London's architecture and design community.

Founded by couple Caroline and Andrew Olah, REDDIE combines contemporary design thinking with traditional craftsmanship. Its furniture is handcrafted in REDDIE's factory in Java, Indonesia, using discarded materials including premium teak salvaged from demolished buildings.

REDDIE's furniture is made to order and can be adapted in colour, finish and size for hospitality, workspace and residential environments. The brand has worked with clients including Google, Sony, Sofitel and Mondrian hotels, with pieces sourced by designers including Alexander & CO, Luchetti Krelle, Hassell, Gensler, M Moser Associates and IA Interior Architects.
