Russell Pinch



Russell Pinch has become one of Heal's Discovers most notable alumni, since winning the award in 2006. He has collaborated with the in-house team of designers on a number of projects, with best-selling pieces including the Wallis sofa and Yves desk.

Russell's refined aesthetic and expert craftsmanship have made him synonymous with contemporary British furniture design and a firm favourite with Heal's customers.

Amechi Mandi



Part of the 2021 Heal's Discovers programme, Amechi explores indigenous African traditions and reimagines them with fresh, fun and exciting designs that add character to any contemporary space.

As part of his inaugural collection for Heal's, Amechi produced a range of soft furnishings and most recently launched a quilt featuring hand-embroidery and delicate beadwork, drawing inspiration from the intricate techniques of the native Kirdi people in West Africa.

Leonhard Pfeifer



Known for his architectural approach to furniture design, Leonhard is driven by the philosophy of removing the superfluous, with a focus on highlighting honest materials and timeless forms.

One of the more recent Heal's Discovers collaborators, Leonhard was featured within the SS25 collection, with his sculptural Oleander range bringing together functional design with architectural precision.



Kirsty Whyte



Originally working as an in-house product and design manager for Heal's, Kirsty takes a customer-centric approach to design and has created a number of bestselling products for the brand over the last decade.

Leading Heal's Discovers as a judge and mentor between 2013 - 2017, Kirsty has been closely involved in the selection, development and production of the programme's winning products. Her own designs for Heal's include the Tower modular shelving, Blythe bedroom furniture and the Pinner four-poster bed.

Kieran Letts



Specialising in handcrafted ceramics and accessories, Kieran's work with Heal's highlighted the importance of artisanal skills in contemporary design, reflecting the brand's heritage of supporting skilled craftsmanship.

Kieran draws upon found objects and coastal forms as a basis for his work, as reflected in his coastal mirrors, which were launched as part of the 2021 Heal's Discovers programme.

The exhibition and panel discussion will be hosted by Pip Rich and is taking place on Tuesday 16th September 6 - 8pm at the Heal's store on Tottenham Court Road. The event is free to attend, but guests need to register via www.heals.com/collections/events.
