Wedge presents *Mise en Abyme: London*, a dualsite exhibition for *London Design Festival 2025* this September. Taking place at Space House in Covent Garden and The Black Shop in King's Cross, the project embodies Wedge's pursuit of ecological material futures, where sustainability becomes a source of beauty rather than a limit.

At Space House, as part of *Material Matters*, Wedge will present the London return of **Epoch II: Anomalies**, first shown at *3daysofdesign* in Copenhagen. Developed through advanced additive sand-printing technology, the collection reflects the studio's ongoing investigations into how new material systems can shape future environments. Sculptural furniture pieces act as both research prototypes and design statements, demonstrating how sustainability can generate new aesthetic languages.

At The Black Shop, Wedge extends this ethos into curatorial practice by bringing together artists and designers whose works resonate with states of material instability, transformation, and recursion. Through installation, moving image, and experimental forms, the exhibition explores how ecological and conceptual approaches to matter can create dreamlike, unstable, and critical encounters.

Together, the two sites reflect Wedge's vision of design as both research and cultural practice: a way of working that entangles sustainability, advanced fabrication, and artistic imagination. *Mise en Abyme: London* invites audiences to experience how ecological material innovation can transform not only objects, but also the narratives and environments in which they exist.
