Reframing Waste: Golden Earth Studio x bloobloom

London, UK - August 2025: Golden Earth Studio and bloobloom present *Reframing Waste*, an exhibition exploring the intersection of art, innovation, and conscious craft in the Anthropocene. Rooted in transparency, circular materials, and ethical craftsmanship. This collaboration transforms bloobloom's Covent Garden store into an immersive clay environment during London Design Festival, where London excavated materials meet refined function.

Each year, the UK produces an estimated 29 million tonnes of excavation waste, yet only half is recovered for secondary use. *Reframing Waste* reimagines these by-products by working with artists who transform the material into fine art and functional ware. The exhibition demonstrates how materials often discarded can become both functional and beautiful.

Featured works include:

Jihuyun Kim - sculptural ceramics

Adam Weissman - rammed earth wall pieces

Alexandra Wong - paintings inspired by the materiality of clay

Louis Vincent - wood turned surface treated clay

Jacob Chan - soda fired ceramic functionalware

The exhibition embodies a shared philosophy: that beauty, responsibility, and innovation can coexist in every object we choose to wear or display.

"At Golden Earth Studio, we see waste as an opportunity rather than an endpoint," said Sara Howard, co-founder of Golden Earth Studio. "This collaboration with bloobloom allows us to demonstrate how materials often overlooked can be reclaimed, refined, and celebrated in contemporary design."
