



This London Design Festival, the company is opening its studio doors with an exhibition to celebrate 35 years of adventures in design. Great things come from good company and this collective of innovators, collaborators and material explorers have to date completed over 3000 projects from Hong Kong to the North Pole.




Working across architecture, interior and brand design, Brinkworth builds brands with impact in every dimension. Their work brings tangibility in a world of intangibility, with an emphasis on what happens in the space between us. There's always an invitation to participate and an understanding that the physical space is the purest form of brand.

The Bethnal Green studio has been Brinkworth's home since the early 1990s, shortly after the company was founded by Adam Brinkworth. It's the cradle of a culture founded in curiosity and a healthy disregard for convention, where unlike-minded people can meet to deliver thoughtful and characterful design full of humanity.

Visitors can delve into the archive of projects, preoccupations and paraphernalia that have kept Brinkworth busy for the last 35 years. The exhibition is a non-hierarchal and barely chronological ramble through objects, sounds and film exploring work, conversations and relationships. It's an opportunity to go behind the scenes and gain access to never-before-seen process and development of past projects, collaborations, and some of the fun that's been had along the way.
