

Netil Open Studios returns after two years

An exclusive opportunity to get insight into the industry-leading work of London's visionary designers.

This London Design Festival, Netil gives unprecedented access to the work of five visionary studios under one roof. From immersive, data-driven installations to unreleased 3D visuals, experimental textiles, and cinematic storytelling, the evening offers a direct line into the practices influencing design today.

Event

For the first time in two years, Netil offers rare access to the work of five visionary studios: Jason Bruges Studio, XK Studio, Totzke, Hito Estudio, and A Running Commentary.

Usually seen only by clients and collaborators, these studios sit at the forefront of design, spanning large-scale installation, hyper-real motion, textile innovation, sensory spatial design, and cinematic storytelling. Visitors will step directly into their working spaces, experiencing the ideas, prototypes, and processes shaping London's creative future.

Jason Bruges Studio | Internationally renowned as a pioneer of the hybrid space between art, architecture and technology, the studio will reveal a series of prototypes that reveal the processes behind recent works, including Energy Dynamics 2024, a data-driven installation and digital frieze..

XK Studio | A leader in hyper-real 3D visuals and moving images that blend artistic vision with technical precision. They will showcase work for OFF Festival alongside unreleased projects, offering insight into their research-led creative process.

Totzke | Known for design-led, hand-crafted rugs for high-spec interiors, Totzke will debut 'Pathways', a collection inspired by textures and colourways of urban environments, from terracotta brickwork to stone pavers in northern Spain..

Hito Estudio | Moving fluidly between food, art, and spatial design, Hito will present an immersive look at how materiality and gastronomy weave together in their practice.

A Running Commentary (A.R.C) | A production company working across live-action and animation, A.R.C will present a series of projections over the night, showcasing the creative process through distorted, art-led visuals, set to live DJs.

Venue

Netil is a landmark of East London's creative scene, home to over 200 studios in the heart of London Fields. First opening as Netil House in 2009, the space expanded last year into the neighbouring building, Netil Corner, with the studio space having now evolved into Netil.

More than a workspace, Netil offers a complete creative ecosystem that prioritises lifestyle seamlessly integrating into work. Rooftop saunas, wellness facilities, and a year-round roster of events ensure residents are part of a connected, collaborative network.

With deep roots in Hackney and strong links across London, Netil remains a destination for those shaping culture, business, and design at the highest level.

For almost two decades, it has redefined the concept of the creative studio, blending functional design with cultural and community-led programming.
