The Gallery is accessed through an evocative glass tunnel, a dramatic feature that provides visitors with a dual viewpoint on the exhibition configuration.

Situated in the basement, The Apartment surpasses its role as just a showroom, presenting an elegant setting that encapsulates Baxter's essence. A cosy living room, a refined dining room with showcooking area and an intimate and refined suite reveal the Baxter style of living. Here, design is transformed into everyday life, immersing guests in a universe of style and comfort.

In this distinctive setting, Baxter will showcase selections from its new Worldwide 2025 collection, alongside the emblematic pieces that have defined the brand's history. Each piece displayed in the Baxter Gallery transcends mere furniture, standing as a work of art crafted to interact with its environment. The space is crafted and adorned with the precision of a tailor, each time in a uniquely different manner. As a result, each set is entirely unique, composed of a mix of elements that is impossible to duplicate.
