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Lozi makes bespoke cabinetry more easily available with new customisable bedroom collection for London Design Festival

East London craft and design studio's system of fitted and standalone pieces combines the personalisation and space efficiency of made-to-measure joinery with the convenience of ready-made furniture

On 15 September 2026, plywood specialist Lozi will unveil a new way to furnish a bedroom: a modular concept that lets customers choose a layout to fit their space, without the cost or wait of commissioning and installing custom-made units.

The collection, hand-crafted entirely in Lozi's Hackney Road workshop, distills its founder Soroush Pourhashemi's 14 years of experience of making bespoke cabinetry and his expertise in designing for small spaces into a curated selection of eight pieces for the bedroom – making its signature design language widely available for the first time.

The system responds to the growing need among Lozi's clients for versatile bedroom spaces in which people can comfortably both sleep and work – a shift that began with the change in working patterns during the pandemic. The modular units (including wardrobes, bedside tables and a murphy bed) can be adapted and combined to create a range of configurations without costly and time-consuming bespoke design work. The complementary standalone pieces (a bed, chest of drawers and desk) draw on Lozi's signature minimal yet warm design language.

Each piece fuses clean, considered forms with refined surfaces, demonstrating Lozi's mastery of the craft of plywood. Four classic surfaces (maple, oak, cherry and walnut), showcase the inherent tactility and marking of the wood.

The units are available online or in the showroom, and hand made to order in Lozi's Work/Shop on Hackney Road in East London. Prices start from £1100.

Lozi's founder Soroush Pourhashemi said

"At Lozi we believe the furniture we surround ourselves with should be more than either beautiful or practical – it should be personal. Since the pandemic, more and more people have needed to make their bedrooms multifunctional – reconfiguring them so they can be used for sleep, work, storage and hobbies. Until now, creating this customised space has required expensive and time-consuming bespoke design. The driving force behind our new Bedroom Collection is to make that well designed, versatile bedroom more accessible."

The Lozi modular bedroom collection comprises 8 pieces, including:

- Three wardrobe designs that can be combined to fit any space: a unit with double doors, a unit with a single door and a curved end unit

- A fold-down Murphy bed with optional bedside table storage cabinets, which can be combined with the wardrobes to create versatile spare room set-ups
- A desk unit that can be a standalone piece or added onto the end of a wardrobe or Murphy bed set up
- A chest of drawers with integrated vanity
- An update on Lozi's bestselling curved bedframe, now with optional bedside tables and headboard.

Press previews will be held in the Lozi showroom on the 15th of September.
