Mama's Bricks presents a house shaped by light and air at London Design Festival 2026

12–20 September 2026 | Triangle Studios, 70 Church Street, London

During London Design Festival 2026, **Mama's Bricks** presents an immersive installation exploring a new relationship between architectural materials, people and the environment.

Designed by **Vanessa Soria Lima**, whose connection to the Bolivian Amazon informs her interest in how architecture responds to increasingly hot climates, the installation takes the form of a house-like structure where conventional walls are transformed into suspended columns of architectural ceramic bricks. Floating within the structure, the bricks create permeable walls that allow **natural light, air and views to move through the space**.

Mama's Bricks combines sculptural geometry with environmental function. Its openings and three-dimensional forms are designed to encourage natural lighting and ventilation, while creating a visual and spatial connection between spaces. where the wall becomes a space for connection — a permeable architectural element that works with the environment, allowing light and air to flow naturally through.

Through the installation, Mama's Bricks proposes an architecture that feels lighter, more permeable and more connected to its surroundings — transforming the brick from a conventional building element into an active part of how a space is experienced.
